

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
CANTON CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT
BOARD OF EDUCATION

MONDAY, APRIL 24, 2006

The Canton City School District Board of Education met in regular session on Monday, April 24, 2006, 7:15 p.m. at McKinley Senior High School, 2323 17th Street, N.W., Canton, Ohio 44708.

Members present: Fred Thompson, John Rinaldi, James Carman, Jr., and Rich Milligan.
Absent: Nadine McIlwain

Staff members in attendance included Dianne Talarico, Tad Ellsworth, and James Reinhard.

President Thompson presided.

At this time, Mr. Thompson led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

At this time, President Thompson welcomed all people in attendance at the regularly scheduled meeting, which included Melissa Griffy, *The Repository*; Jackie Leisure, president of OAPSE 609; Nancy Molnar, *Akron Beacon Journal*; Barbara Stanley, president of OAPSE 161; Jim Watson, president of OAPSE 107; Alan Zarek, WHBC.

At this time, Dianne Talarico, Superintendent, reported the "good things happening" in Canton City Schools:

- Rodney Conrad and Andrea Summerlot were introduced by the Superintendent as representatives of the Public Relations Committee. Mr. Conrad introduced the committee members and gave an overview of the committee's work to date. Mrs. Summerlot informed the Board of the committee's accomplishments and various events promoting public education. The Board and the Superintendent thanked the PR Committee for working together in support of public education.
- The Board and the Superintendent thanked Mr. Common and Mr. Duff for their trip to Columbus to oppose vouchers and inadequate school funding.
- Matt Meeks and Troy Wagner, two CHAP students from **Harter Elementary School**, placed first in the CCS Math Olympics.

- **Crenshaw Middle School** hosted a “Students vs. Staff” basketball game and raised \$500 for Larez Alexander.
- Alice Slonecker, a long-time volunteer at **Youtz Elementary School** who is terminally ill, was recognized for her fundraising efforts to purchase playground equipment for the school.
- **Timken Senior High School** held a school-wide book read of *Speak* by Laurie Halse Anderson. After visiting the campus, Ms. Anderson posted comments on her online journal commending the Timken administration and staff.
- Mr. Milligan commended the staff of **Timken Senior High School** on the many positive things happening at the school and stated that the media has not been fair in its coverage of teen pregnancy at Timken.
- Mr. Rinaldi asked that everyone support the CCS Foundation Dinner Raffle on May 15, 2006 to be held at Windsor Hall.
- Mr. Rinaldi reported on the various programs that are offered through the Canton City Joint Recreational District.
- Mr. Rinaldi informed that an intern position with Milwaukee Brewers is being filled by a CCS graduate.
- Mr. Rinaldi also thanked Mr. Common and Mr. Duff for contacting State legislators to oppose vouchers.
- Mr. Thompson also gave favorable comments on **Timken Senior High School** administration’s handling of the media despite the media’s unfair coverage.

Be It Resolved that this Board of Education does reject the bids to repair the concrete on the North Stands at Fawcett Stadium because of the change of scope of the project.

WHEREAS, Fawcett Stadium requires repair work to accommodate the Hall of Fame activities for the 2006 festival: and

WHEREAS, compliance with the procedures for the advertisement of bids prescribed by RC 3313.46 would delay the commencement of the needed repairs and could result in the repairs not being completed for the festival:

WHEREAS, a necessary change of scope for the Fawcett Stadium project was discovered after prior bids were solicited and opened resulting in a revised scope of work:

BE IT RESOLVED by this Board of Education, that:

Section 1. It is found and determined pursuant to RC 3313.46 that there is an urgent necessity for repair work to Fawcett Stadium.

Section 2. It is further found and determined that compliance with the procedures for the advertisements for bids prescribed by RC 3313.46 would delay commencement of the needed repairs and pose a potential threat to the completion of the work in a timely manner.

Section 3. The Business Manager is hereby authorized to enter into a contract for the necessary repairs without competitive bids.
