

Notes on Supplemental Educational Services 2007-2008

For the 2007-2008 school year, Canton City Schools had a total of 877 students qualify for Supplemental Educational Services under the No Child Left Behind Act. At Allen Elementary, 103 students in grades 3, 4, 5 and 6 qualified. At Belden Elementary, 114 students qualified in grades 3, 4, 5 and 6. At Gibbs Elementary 102 students in grades 3, 4, 5 and 6 qualified. At Hartford Middle School, 251 students in grades 7 and 8 qualified. At Souers Middle School, 307 students in grades 7 and 8 qualified. At Hartford and Souers Middle Schools, all students qualified and were given the opportunity to participate in Supplemental Educational Services, as there was not a middle school available for Public School Choice.

All parents or guardians of students who qualified were sent letters informing them of the availability of Supplemental Educational Services and parent meetings at respective schools. Letters were mailed and meetings held in early October. A total of 32 parents came to schools to attend the parent meetings.

Parents who did not or could not attend parent meetings were asked to contact their School Community Worker to assist parents with signing up their children for Supplemental Educational Services. Some parents called the Administrative Center, spoke with Patricia Rohrer and were mailed information packets. These packets included; an Application, Selection Form and Parent booklet with a list of Providers and their advertisements. Parents were asked to return the Application and Selection Form to Patricia Rohrer at the Administrative Center.

There were 65 students signed up to receive Supplemental Educational Services. Parents/guardians selected 8 Providers from a list of 194. The 8 Supplemental Educational Service Providers selected by parents were:

- A to Z In-Home Tutoring (Individual, Face to face)
- Academia.Net, Inc. (Online)
- Alternatives Unlimited (Individual, Face to face)
- Club Z In Home Tutoring (Face to face)
- Kumon Math & Reading Center (Individual, face to face)
- Greater Stark County Urban League (Small group, individual, face to face)
- Tutorial Services (Online)
- W.A.T.O.E.S. (We Are Troubled On Every Side) Outreach (Small group, individual face to face)

An informational meeting was held for the eight Supplemental Educational Service Providers at the Wells Administrative Center on October 30, 2007 from 10:00AM to 11:30 AM. The purpose of this meeting was to give Providers the opportunity to learn about Canton City Schools' expectations, procedures, progress reporting, Student Learning Plans and to answer questions Providers had regarding Supplemental Educational Services for the 2007-2008 school year.

Contracts were sent to and returned from each of the 8 providers. Signed contracts legally bind all the Supplemental Educational Service Providers to submit timely invoices, keep attendance and academic records for tutoring services rendered. The total allocation (set aside) for each student who qualifies is \$1,464.96.
