Technology Tips:

- Do you ever want to work on something that you started working on at school and wanted to continue working on at home? Here are 2 simple ways to take your file or document with you wherever you go.
 1. Flash/Pen drive: These lipstick-like devices connect to a USB port on any computer and range in price and space for saving items. Many times they come with a lanyard and are worn around the neck.
 2. After saving your document or file on the computer you created it on, log in to your e-mail, attach the document and send the e-mail. Then you can log into your e-mail from any location and open the file to continue working.
- If you run into a problem with a particular website not working the way you think it should, try using a different web browser (Internet Explorer, Safari, Firefox, etc.). Different web pages work better, and some not at all, with certain browsers. This also applies to web-based resources such as Riverdeep, POW-PAK, and United Streaming. Many times a preferred browser is communicated through training.
